what this is

six nights: dreamed six nights up in a late night idea exchange. to give birth to a community of playwrights we'd give six amazing writers a challenge: asked each to write a play designed to shine at one particular place on the whole entire earth, but flexible enough to play in five other places. the result is what you see here now.

who we are

sanctuary: playwrights theatre demonstrates what playwrights can do when operating as a stage-oriented community, not just page-oriented individuals. we're asking the question: "what if a theatre company had playwrights at its center rather than its periphery?" inspired by an article todd london wrote in the november 2002 issue of american theatre (**the shape of plays to come**), and powered by sheer wildness, we hereby set out on this here quest...

and now, the playwrights...

in japan people who make a huge contribution to the social, cultural or life quality of the nation are designated living national treasures. would that we had this tradition in the us. if we did, these six playwrights would all bear the designation. these guys are what this is really all about. these are our living national treasures.

(Playwright/*The Island of Never Giving Way on Your Desire*) has been produced at Lincoln Center's American Living Room Festival at HERE, and the Ohio Theater. His writing has been widely anthologized.

Sung Rno

(Playwright/*Weather*) has had productions in America and Seoul, Korea. He received a 2003-2004 National Endowment for the Arts/TCG grant, a 2003 Whitfield/Cook prize, and has been anthologized.

Caridad Svich

(Playwright/*A Short Time After*) is a playwright, songwriter, translator, and editor. She held an NEA/TCG Residency at the Mark Taper Forum Theatre, a TCG/Pew residency at INTAR Theatre. *The Booth Variations*, a multimedia piece, recently ran in New York.

the directors

Sarah Benson (Director/*The Island of Never Giving Way on Your Desire*) is the Associate at Soho Rep where she is co-chairing the 2004-05 Writer/Director Lab alongside Jason Grote. Originally from England, Sarah was a founding member of Arion, who have performed at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival, and in London, Oxford, and Rome. Since moving to New York Sarah has directed work at the American Theater Nexus Series at BRIC Studio, The American Living Room at HERE, La Mama, The Flea, Medicine Show, and the New Workshop Theater BC. Sarah is the recipient of a 2002-03 Fulbright Scholarship, the 2003-04 Joel Zwick Directing Award, and a Buchwald Fellowship. Sarah holds an MFA in Directing from Brooklyn College (CUNY). She is a founding member of the International Company Project whose production of Euripides' *Orestes* was recently seen at the Experimental Wing of the National Theatre of Greece in Athens.

Lear deBessonnet (Director/*A Short Time After*) has assisted Martha Clarke, Anne Bogart, and Marianne Weems, and has trained with DAH Teatar of Yugoslavia and the SITI Company in New York. Directing/devising credits include *The Eliots* (Center Stage, NYC), *transFigures* (Calvary Church, NYC), *The Female Terrorist Project* (HERE Arts Center), *Equus* (Hangar Theatre), *L'Histoire du Canard* (NYU Graduate Acting, Freeplay), and *Whiskey Girl* (Hangar Theatre). She has developed new plays with Soho Rep, the Cherry Lane, Horse Trade Theatre Group, and The Committee in New York. Internationally, Lear directed a new tri-lingual musical for the National Opera Theatre of Kazakhstan (*In the Dark Ages*). She is a Drama League Directing Fellow, and a Jefferson Scholar.
